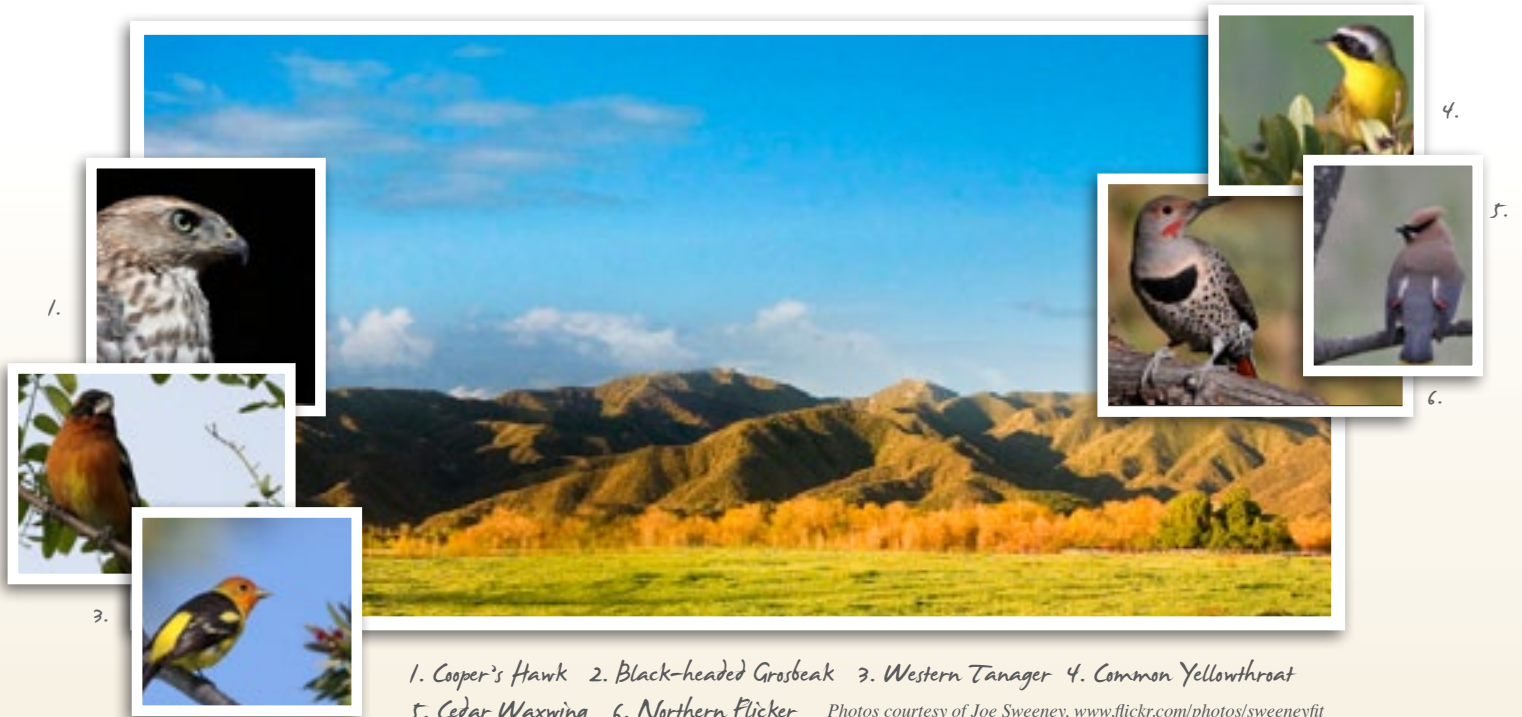


BIRDS OF GLEN IVY and the TEMESCAL VALLEY

Glen Ivy Hot Springs enjoys the benefits of being situated in what is called an “ecotone,” a place where two adjacent, but very different ecosystems blend together and support a greater number of plant, animal, and bird species. In this case, the slopes of the Santa Ana Mountains meet the low California scrub brush landscape—creating a home to over 150 species of birds.

The joy of birdwatching has long been a source of curiosity and fascination for staff and guests here at the Hot Springs. The waters that flow out of Coldwater Canyon create a unique oasis environment that supports both year-round resident and migrating birds. Ancient oak trees provide a home and food for Acorn Woodpeckers and Nuthatches while the



various native palms on our lush Spa grounds offer just the right fiber for the Hooded Orioles to weave its hanging nest.

We hope that this list helps you become more acquainted with our local and migrating birds as well as enjoy the natural beauty and mindful moments that bird watching can bring.
